

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 4th day of August, 1941 that:

WHEREAS, under date of November 19, 1940 the Tribal Council passed a resolution approving the expenditure of \$6,500 from Individual Indian Money, White Mountain Apache Tribal fund for the construction of a community building in the Cibecue District, and

WHEREAS, the total cost of the building was estimated at \$11,000, one-half of which was contemplated would be paid from "Interest on Proceeds of Labor," and

WHEREAS, it now appears desirable to pay the entire cost of the construction of the Community Building, estimated at \$11,000, from funds in the Individual Indian Money Account of the Tribe,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council recommends and approves the expenditure of the entire \$11,000 from the Individual Indian Money, White Mountain Apache Tribal Account for the construction of a community building in the Cibecue District, subject to the approval of the Secretary of the Interior, and that the appropriation of \$4,500 authorized under budget authority of July 15, 1940 from "Interest on Proceeds of Labor", which has not been expended, remain in the Treasury.

The foregoing resolution was on August 4, 1941 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) & (e) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
