

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
PORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this date September 8, 1941, that:

WHEREAS, the Council has been advised that \$800 of tribal funds will be ample to assist in carrying on the AAA water development project within the reservation plus \$100 for the construction of $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles of road to tank site at Upper Cedar Creek.

NOW BE IT RESOLVED that the Superintendent be authorized to expend \$900 from the Individual Indian Money, White Mountain Apache Tribal Account so that the tribe may now meet its portion of the expenditure in connection with water development under the AAA activity now going on within the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on September 8, 1941 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) and (e) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
