

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION.

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this date November 4, 1941 that:

WHEREAS, the Council makes a great many business trips to various sections of the Reservation to investigate tribal projects, and

WHEREAS, only one or two members of the Council own cars for transportation and the question of transportation is always a problem, the council has considered the advisability and discussed with the Assistant Commissioner, Mr. Zimmerman, the question of purchasing a Station Wagon for the use of the Council on official business, and the Assistant Commissioner, advises that he sees no objection of such purchase,

BE IT NOW RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Interior be requested to approve the expenditure of \$1000 or so much thereof that may be necessary from Individual Indian Money-White Mountain Apache Tribal Account for the purchases of a Station Wagon for the official use of the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on November 4, 1941 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) & (e) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 15 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
