## RESCLUTION

WYPREAS, the Tribal pusiness at this time does not justify the expense of maintaining a capable Treasurer at the Agenty to receipt for and pay out Tribal Funds belonging to and paid out by the authority of the Tribe, in order to facilitate the collecting, safekeeping and dishursement of funds coming within the control of the Touncii, it is hereby

Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation be and he is hereby authorized to act as the agent of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in collecting any funds due the White Mountain Apache Tribe. The Superintendent shall issue a receipt on his official receipt form, indicating thereon that the collection is made in behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and shall deposit such funds in an Individual Indian Moneys Account to the credit of the White Mountain Apache Tribe. Disbursements of these funds shall be made by the Superintendent or his bonder deputy upon the approval of this Resolution by and during the term of the present Council. The records of this account shall be open for inspection of the tribe and its officers during regular business hours and it shall be the day of the Treasurer to render a statement to the Council at least once a year or when called for.

The foregoing resolutions was this 4th day of January 1943 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and O against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (n), Article VI of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934(48 Stat.384).

## RESCLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

SE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in special session this date October 23, 1942 that:

WHIFEAS the Tribal Council has had under consideration for more than a year, the formulating and adoption of regulations that will make it possible to more equitably utilize the range by all who desire to run livestock thereon, and

YHEREAS, there has been considerable disagreement and controversy over regulations to be adopted, after lengthy discussion and deliberation the Council has formulated and revised the attached regulations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT AFSOLVE! that the attached regulations be adopted for improved grazing within the Fort Apache Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was this 23d day of October, 1942, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 1 against by the Tribel Council of the White Mountain Apaces Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1935, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
