

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 GORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this date, August 7, 1944, that:

The Big Steeple timber tract, containing approximately three million board feet of timber, be advertised for sale to the highest bidder, provided that:

1. that portion of "General Timber Sales Regulations" concerning brush disposal, and in particular that portion thereof which requires cutting, piling and burning of all limbs four inches and under be strictly enforced by the Forest Officer in charge.
2. Spruce Pine, Mountain White Pine and Douglas Fir be advertised at not less than \$3.50 per M and other species at not less than \$1.50 per M.

The foregoing resolution was made this first day of August, 1944 and duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (a), Article VI of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 23, 1938, pursuant to Section 14 of the Act of June 18 1906 (34 Stat. 224).
