

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE IN THE  
SOUTHWEST INDIAN RESERVATION.

WHEREAS, in accordance with authority granted in office letter of December 17, 1943, the Walnut Canyon Timber Lake Unit was advertised for sale to the highest bidder, and

WHEREAS, The Loring Brothers of Holbrook, Arizona and the Southwest Lumber Mills, Inc., of Mary, Arizona proffered identical bids of \$5.45 per M for Ponderosa pine, Mexican White Pine and Douglas Fir and \$1.90 per M for other species,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache tribe in regular session this 4th day of February, 1946, that the timber on the Walnut Canyon Unit be sold to that bidder to whom the Commissioner of Indian Affairs awards bids, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the chairman and secretary of the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe are hereby authorized to sign for and on behalf of said tribe a contract covering sale of the timber on the Walnut Canyon Unit.

The foregoing resolution was on February 4th, 1946 duly adopted by a vote of \_\_\_ for and \_\_\_ against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by article VI, Section 1 (e) of the Constitution and by-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1936 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
