RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in session this 29th day of July 1946, that:

WHEREAS, IT is desired to obtain technical information and data on the timber stand in the area of the reservation known as the Carrise Working Circle for the purpose of determining the policies and practices that should be followed in managing the forest of the area in accordance with sound forest management and to assure that cutting of timber in the area shall be on a sustained yield basis,

WHEREAS, only a portion of the standing timber of the Carrise Working Circle has been cruised, and

WHEREAS, complete data and technical information are required before any of the timber may be sold,

NOW BE IT RESOLVED that in order to obtain the necessary data and information required on the Carrise Working Circle the Council does hereby appropriate the sum of twenty Thousand Dollars (20,000) of funds of the tribe in Individual Indian Money on deposit with the Fort Apache Indian Agency for necessary expenses, including the employment of foresters and assistants to make the necessary surveys and timber studies and to complete a forest management plan for the forested area of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation known as the Carrise Working Circle.

The foregoing resolution has on this date, the 29th day of July 1946 been duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the tribal council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to Authority vested in it by Section 1 (e) Article VI of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 16, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
