RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is need of additional range improvements for the better handling of range livestock, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that there is hereby appropriated from available funds on deposit with the Fort Apache Agency to the credit of the Tribe, the sum of \$10,000 to be used for the construction and repair of stock traps and fences and to remain available until expended provided that not to exceed \$1,000 of this appropriation shall be used in any one livestock or association district, and provided further that the said traps and fences proposed for construction and maintenance shall be approved by the Livestock Association officers of the District concerned and shall have the concurrance of the Agricultural Extension Agent and Forest Supervisior prior to the commencing said work.

The foregoing resolution was, on February 17, 1947, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 14, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
