RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MCUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Peservation in regular session this 9th day of June, 1947, that:

WHERFAS, the Assembly of God Church has requested the use of two (2) acres of land, more or less, for use of the Church in carrying an missionary work among the Indians of Fort Apeche Reservation.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESCLVED that the following described land is hereby reserved for the use of the Assembly of God Church for such length of time as the said shurch uses it exclusively for missionary and church purposes:

Originating within the woundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, State of Arizona, County of Navajo, East of the Gila and Salt River Meridan and the property set aside for Agency Administrative Buildings and known as Whiteriver, Arizona, and the intersection of the Luthern Church Street of said site and Arizona State Highway No. %3, Thence 1129.0 feet N 5°30' East along the center line of said highway to a point, thence 100.0 feet due West to the SE Corner and the POINT OF BEGINNING, thence 200.0 feet due West to the SW Corner, thence 400.0 feet due North to the HW Corner, thence 248.7 due East to the NE Corner, thence 402.0 feet S 5° 30' W to the SE Corner and the POINT OF BEGINNING.

The use of this said tract of land shall entitle said Assembly of God Church to construct such church buildings and necessary residences for church employees as needed.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted on June 9, 1947, by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VIII, of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
