

RESOLUTION
of the
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE
of the
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

NO. 274

WHEREAS there is need of a new automobile for use of the police employed by the tribe to maintain law and order on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation to replace old and worn out automobiles, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in special session this 19th. day of January, 1945 that the Commissioner of Indian Affairs be requested to authorize the sale of two old automobiles consisting of one Chevrolet two-door sedan Motor No. 1068874, Serial No. 10808-170082, Year 1937; and one Chevrolet coupe, Motor No. 896690, Year 1941 and to apply the proceeds of said sale outwards the purchase of one new four-door sedan for use of the police of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, provided that in the event the amount received from the sale of the two vehicles described herein is not sufficient to cover the purchase of the one new vehicle then the use of sufficient Tribal Funds as may be required to provide funds for said purchase are hereby authorized and appropriated from Tribal Funds on deposit with the Fort Apache Indian Agency and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in order to provide needed transportation for use of the police until such time as a new automobile is obtained there is hereby authorized and appropriated from Tribal Funds on deposit with the Fort Apache Indian Agency the sum of \$300 for repair of Ford Sedan No. L-4369; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in order to provide additional quarters for Indian police the sum of not to exceed \$200 is hereby authorized and appropriated from tribal funds on deposit with the Fort Apache Indian Agency for repairs to former Judges quarters.

The foregoing resolution Number 274 was on January 19, 1945 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and none against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 25, 1934 (48 Stat. 964).
