

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Reservation that, in order to promote more efficient police work and in order to provide for recognition of meritorious police work, periodic promotions in pay may be granted Indian police paid from court funds in amounts not exceeding \$10.00 per month upon recommendation of the Special Officer and upon approval of the Superintendent and with the concurrence of the Chairman of the Tribal Council provided such promotions shall not be made more often than three times per year, provided further that the pay of such Indian police shall not exceed \$150.00 per month.

The foregoing resolution was on May 2, 1949, duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (g) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 16, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
