

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

That authorized by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, in regular meeting assembled this 2nd day of May, 1949, a quorum being present, that in order to provide funds for the continuation of certain tribal activities, for educational, welfare and recreational purposes of the Indians, and for the development, protection and conservation of reservation resources, and for other purposes, during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1949 and ending June 30, 1950, there is hereby authorized and appropriated from tribal funds on deposit in an Individual Indian Money account of the Fort Apache Indian Agency the following amounts for the purposes set forth:

Section 1. Tribal Council Expenses

(a) Tribal Council members per diem - pay for meeting and travel	\$1800	
(b) Supplies, printing, office equipment, miscellaneous expenses	600	
(c) Expenses for Tribal members to attend summer school	<u>2800</u>

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon the completion of any one project as outlined in Sections 1 through 11 of this Resolution, that any unobligated and unexpended balance remaining may be diverted to other projects or purposes set forth in Sections 1 through 11 up to 10 percentum of the amount herein provided for that

project or purpose, providing such diversion of funds be only with the consent in writing of the Chairman or Acting Chairman of the Tribal Council. Unobligated balances remaining on June 30, 1950 shall automatically revert to general tribal funds.

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED that funds set forth in Sections 1 through Section 11 herein represent the amounts estimated for tribal activities for the year beginning July 1, 1949, but in the event additional or supplemental funds may be required such funds shall be appropriated only by resolution of the Council and shall be referred to as supplemental to resolution No. 292.

The foregoing resolution was on May 2, 1949, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Reservation that, the memorandum agreement among the Arizona Game and Fish Commission, Bureau of Indian Affairs and Fish and Wildlife Service for the operation of the Williams Creek Fish Hatchery on the Fort Apache Reservation which was approved by the respective parties in 1946 is hereby approved for the year beginning July 1, 1949, in accordance with Section 13 of the agreement.

The foregoing resolution was on May 2, 1949, duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (a) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
