

RESOLUTION
of the
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE
of the
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Reservation that, in order to provide protection for fields and orchards being damaged by beaver and to provide for adequate distribution of beaver on the Fort Apache Reservation that the report and management plan submitted by Mr. C. H. Aldous of Fish and Wildlife Service dated January, 1949 be hereby approved subject to such revision as may be justified at a later date.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such beaver pelts as may be taken under authority of this resolution may be sold under authority of the Tribal Council.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the proceeds realized from the sale of beaver pelts taken under authority of this resolution shall be deposited to the credit of the White Mountain Apache Tribe at Fort Apache Agency and such proceeds may be used for the purposes of carrying out the beaver management plan.

The foregoing resolution was on February 7, 1949, duly adopted by a vote of 5 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (a) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1948 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
