

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 PORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in order to provide funds for the continuation of certain tribal activities, for educational, welfare and recreational purposes for the members of the Tribe, and for the development, protection and conservation of reservation resources and for other purposes, during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1950 and ending June 30, 1951, there is hereby authorized and appropriated from tribal funds in an Individual Indian Money Account of the Fort Apache Agency the following amounts for the purposes set forth:

BE IT RESOLVED that funds remaining unexpended on June 30, 1950 of the amounts authorized in Tribal Resolution No. 292 in Section 5 (d) and (h), Section 10 and in Resolution No. 50-17 shall remain available for the purposes authorized until said projects are completed; PROVIDED the funds authorized in Section 10 of Resolution No. 292 shall also be available for development of water supplies for the residents and business located at Fort Apache Junction.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that not to exceed 20 per centum of the amount of any one specific authorization included in Sections 1 through 9 herein may be transferred to other specific purposes herein authorized, PROVIDED such transfer is approved in writing by the Chairman (or Acting Chairman) of the Tribal Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that unless otherwise provided unobligated balances remaining on June 30, 1951 shall be returned to general tribal funds, PROVIDED however that additional or supplemental funds may be provided by appropriate Amendments to this Resolution.

The foregoing Resolution was on May 31, 1950 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and none against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1933 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1933 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
