

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, between August 31 and September 4, 1950 a forest fire south-west of Faught Ridge Lookout tower burned over about 4,000 acres of Ponderosa pine forest land and killed or damaged about 2,500,000 board feet of timber, and

WHEREAS, this killed and damaged timber will, unless logged within a year become unmerchantable,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in session the 6th day of November, 1950 that the fire damaged and killed timber on the said Faught Ridge Burn be advertised at the minimum price of _____ per M and sold to the highest bidder, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of the White Mountain Apache Tribe are hereby authorized to sign for and in behalf of the said tribe a contract covering the sale of killed and damaged timber on the Faught Ridge Burn.

The foregoing Resolution was on November 6, 1950 duly adopted by a vote of _____ for and _____ against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 904).
