

RESOLUTION OF THE
THE "WHITE APACHE TRIBE OF THE
WHITE APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Dog Creek Aspen Timber Unit contract has expired on March 31, 1951 after having been in effect since January 17, 1947, and

WHEREAS, there is still several thousands of cords of aspen timber yet available in this same area, and that the Sno-Fluff Accelerator Manufacturing Company has requested advertisement of this timber,

DO HEREBY RESOLVE by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in its regular session this 6th day of August 1951 that this timber to the amount of 3000 cords be advertised at a minimum price of \$1.00 per cord and sold to the highest bidder,

AND IT IS RECOMMENDED that the Chairman and Secretary of the Tribal Council of the Tribe be authorized to sign for and on behalf of said Tribe any contract covering sale of said aspen timber.

The foregoing resolution was on August 6, 1951 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (44 Stat. 984).
