RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE HOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the district state highway engineer desires to complete the clearing for the construction of the new highway 73 from McNary to Springer-ville, and
- WHEREAS, this next portion is approximately 3.1 miles in length and contains approximately 40 acres of pine, fir and spruce together having a volume of approximately 400,000 board feet,
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Superintendent be instructed to advertise this said amount of timber at a minimum price of twelve dollars (\$12.00) per thousand board feet gross tree scale for all species and that a sale be made according to regulations to the highest acceptable bidder,
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that tribal funds not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) be made available for newspaper advertisement, and that the Tribal Chairman and Secretary be authorised to sign the contract for this proposed sale.

The foregoing Resolution was on August 3, 1953 duly adopted by a vote of

8 for and 0 against, by the Tribel Council of the White Mountain Apache
Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the
Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938
and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
