

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that all possible revenue accrue to the tribe through development of its mining possibilities, and

WHEREAS, Eugene King of Showlow, Arizona, has applied for a prospecting permit in Canyon Creek area for iron ore only

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session that a permit be granted to Eugene King of Showlow, Arizona for iron ore only in the Canyon Creek area of the Fort Apache Reservation, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this permit will be in force for 30 days only, beginning on March 26, 1956 and expiring on April 25, 1956.

The foregoing resolution was on March 14, 1956 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 904).
