RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE HOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, W. M. O'Dell and Mary Amenda Hunsaker, widow, individuals, and Keasby and Mattison Company, a Pennsylvania Corporation, are now the lessees of certain unpatented asbestos mining claims located on the White Mountain Indian Reservation, Contract Number I-30-Ind-2523, and
- WHEREAS, W. M. O'Dell has assigned all his right title and interest in and to said mining claims to Amanda Humsaker, and
- WHEREAS, the lessees have not been operating said claims and therefore the Tribe is not realizing any income from same, and
- WHEREAS, the said Amanda Hunsaker, through her attorney, has advised the Council that if the assignment is approved mining operations will start, and
- WHEREAS, it appears by permitting the said assignment the Tribe will be in a better position to realise income from said claims,
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESCRIVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the assignment from W. M. O'Dell to Amenda Hunsaker of an undivided ene-third interest in and to said mining claims and lease is hereby approved.
- BE IT FURTHER RESCLVED that a copy of this resolution be attached to the original assignment and forwarded to the Secretary of the Interior.

The foregoing resolution was on the 19th day of November, 1956 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
