

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is aware of the fact that more than two-thirds of the individual income of the White Mountain Apache people is from the livestock industry, and

WHEREAS, The Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes its responsibility to maintain and improve the breeding and quality of livestock on the reservation, and

WHEREAS, the present progress in range improvements makes it especially imperative that our ranges be kept up to stocking capacity, and that we have the opportunity to restock our ranges with well-bred registered cattle at a reasonable price;

WHEREAS, by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe it was voted by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to appropriate the sum of \$20,000 be appropriated from the General funds of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for the immediate purchase of breeding stock.

This resolution was on file on April 1, 1957 duly adopted by a vote of \_\_\_\_\_ for and \_\_\_\_\_ against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the members (•) or the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the members (•) on August 10, 1950 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 27, 1951 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 10, 1934 (3 Stat. 912).
