

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Silas O. Davis, deceased, served the White Mountain Apache Tribe in an exemplary manner as its Recreation Manager, and

WHEREAS, in said position he worked long and arduous hours furthering the interests of the White Mountain Apache people, and

WHEREAS, his paramount interest was always the welfare of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and


WHEREAS, his long cherished dream had been the construction of Smith Park Dam and the enterprise appertaining thereto, and

WHEREAS, largely through his efforts the dam was finally constructed but his untimely death prevented the building of the enterprise relating thereto, and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to posthumously show their appreciation for a keen interest shown in the White Mountain Apache people.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council match privately donated funds for the construction of a monument to be placed on Smith Park Dam in memory of Silas O. Davis. Said matching funds not to exceed the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.)

The foregoing Resolution was on April 8, 1958 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d, (e) and (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
