

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, since its inception the Fort Apache telephone system has been owned and operated by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and

WHEREAS, it is the present policy of the Government to abdicate all utility business, and

WHEREAS, it will take approximately Seven Thousand Dollars to rehabilitate said system, and

WHEREAS, Congress has refused to appropriate any funds for said rehabilitation, thus leaving the White Mountain Apache Tribe no alternative except to approve the sale of the system to a private company.

The foregoing resolution was on September 5, 1958, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) and (c) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
