

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the logging and milling contract for a portion of Big Canyon Logging Unit with Eldon Stratton was executed November 12, 1959 per Resolution No. 59-16 and was given an additional time extension to August 1, 1961 by Resolution No. 60-30, and

WHEREAS, the Big Canyon Unit has very little fir timber thereon which was in demand from Fort Apache Wholesale Lumber Company and the contractor was therefore instructed to log in Diamond Creek No. 1 Logging Unit using all of his equipment and therefore needs additional time for logging the Big Canyon Unit.

BE IT RESOLVED that the contractor be granted until December 31, 1961 to complete his logging in Big Canyon and until December 31, 1962 to complete his slash disposal and other obligations as per his contract.

The foregoing resolution was on November 2, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

Resolution No. 61-110 grants an additional time extension to Eldon H. Stratton to complete his logging operations on the Big Canyon Logging Unit to December 31, 1961. It also grants an extension of time for completion of slash disposal and other obligations until December 31, 1962. This extension was necessary due to the demand for fir timber by the Fort Apache Wholesale Lumber Company, which was not available on the Big Canyon Unit. Therefore, it was necessary for Mr. Stratton to use all of his equipment on the Diamond Creek No. 1 Logging Unit in order to meet the demand for fir timber and was unable to complete his logging operations on the Big Canyon Unit.

The resolution was adopted on November 2, 1961 by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Tribe's Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior.
