

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, United States Public Health Service is contemplating terminating the hospital facilities of the Apache Tribe of the Mescalero Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Indian people on various reservations of the United States are in great need of improved hospital facilities in order to insure that they will be physically fit so that they may better develop their human and natural resources, and

WHEREAS, the said closing of the Mescalero hospital facility would deprive the Indians of the reservation from receiving the medical care that they so badly need.


BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council unanimously oppose the closing of the said U. S. Public Health Service facilities on the Mescalero Apache Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the entire Arizona delegation.

The foregoing resolution was on March 7, 1962 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
