## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Arizona State Highway Department has made application for a revocable permit for a Highway Maintenance Camp covering the following described land located in Navajo County, Arizona, to wit:

On Arizona State Highway 73 beginning at the right of way marker left of Station 84+81.34 S.T.; thence easterly on bearing south 84°50°15″E on said right of way line to Station 89+65, point of beginning. Thence 90° left for a distance of 600 feet along the east boundary of driveway; thence continuing 250 feet along the same line to the northeasterly corner of maintenance camp site; thence 90° left for a distance of 400 feet to the northeast corner of maintenance camp lot; thence 90° in a southerly direction for a distance of 250 feet to the southeasterly corner of said maintenance camp lot; thence easterly for a distance of 350 feet to the point of juncture with the west boundary of driveway; thence 90° to the right proceeding along the west boundary of the driveway to a distance of 600 feet to the intersection of Arizona State Highway 73 right of way line at station 89+15, thus describing a driveway 50 feet by 600 feet and maintenance camp site 250 feet by 400 feet.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency is hereby authorized and directed to issue a revocable permit for a period of of five (5) years covering the above described land to the Arizona State Highway Department, said land to be used for a Highway Maintenance Camp.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the rental for the use of the said land shall be at the rate recommended on an appraisal made by the Eureau of Indian Affairs.

The foregoing resolution was on February 7, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1953, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 934).
