## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the following listed people have organized to form the East Fork-Canyon Day Selp Help Home Builders project:

- WHEREAS, a loan has been made to each of these families to finance the construction of certain houses located on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the amount of \$400.00 has been allowed in each loan to provide subsistance for the participants during the period of construction, and
- WHEREAS, Section 25 of the approved Declaration of Policy and Plan of Operation Tribal Credit Program indicates that: The subsistance funds would normally accrue interest at 7% whereas the building funds accrue interest at a rate of 5%, and
- WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Tribal Council to consider all funds advanced as building funds regardless of the use of such funds.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the interest rate for the entire loan advanced to the members of the East Fork-Canyon Day Home Builders Project be accrued at the rate of 5%.

The foregoing resolution was on February 7, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and O against by the Tribal Council of the White Hountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a), (i), (s) & (t) of the Amendec Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
