RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 63-23, the Chairman and the Secretary, among other things, were authorized to enter into a lease agreement with the Department of Anthropology of the University of Arizona, and
- WHEREAS, the said resolution provided for three, three-year successive options for renewal, which options are against regulations, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe desires to in addition to the lease to grant the Anthropology Department the right and privilege to conduct archaeological studies on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED that Resolution No. 63-23 is hereby rescinded.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary, with the approval of the Superintendent, are hereby authorized to execute for and on behalf of the Tribe, a five year lease with an option to renew for an additional five year period with the Director, Arizona State Museum, representing the Department of Anthropology of the University of Arizona for five acres of ground within a one mile radius of Grasshopper Stockman's Headquarters on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for an annual rental payable in advance of \$200.00.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Anthropology Department is hereby granted permission during the tenure of the lease to conduct archaeological studies on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and the Superintendent is requested together with the Chairman to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the granting to the department, the privilege to make these studies.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said lease, among other things, is to provide that the Anthropology Department shall grant preference to the White Mountain Apaches for such labor as is required in connection with the construction and maintenance of the buildings and plant and at such time if the buildings and improvements are no longer required by the Anthropology Department, or upon the termination of this lease, said buildings and all improvements shall revert to and become the property of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on April 4, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
