RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the education of the Indian children on the reservation is of a prime importance to the welfare of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees, School District No. 3, Maverick, Apache County, Arizona, has requested a lease of a certain site on the reservation for the purpose of constructing an elementary school thereon.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tribal Council is authorized for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to execute a twenty five year gratuitous lease with an option to renew for an additional period of twenty five years with the Board of Trustees, School District No. 3, Maverick, Apache County, Arizona, for the construction of an elementary school and other school buildings on said site.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the area being leased is located on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and described as follows:

Beginning at a point S26degrees 16'E, 614.5 feet from corner 10 of the Maverick Townsite Boundary; thence S29degrees19'W, 200.0 feet; thence N 64degrees04'W, 250.0 feet; thence S18degrees41'W 147.0 feet; thence S57degrees35'E, 160.0 feet; thence N29degrees 15'E, 62.0 feet; thence S55 degrees25'E, 450.0 feet; thence N34degrees35'E, 170.0 feet; thence N36degrees37'W, 439.0 feet to the point of beginning. Said parcel of land contains 2.953 acres.

The foregoing resolution was on May 1, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
