

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Mr. Edward L. Webb, Branch of Wildlife Research, Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, has presented a request to conduct a Research Project to study the Habitat Requirements of Merriam Wild Turkey on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Recreation Board has recommended approval of the request, and

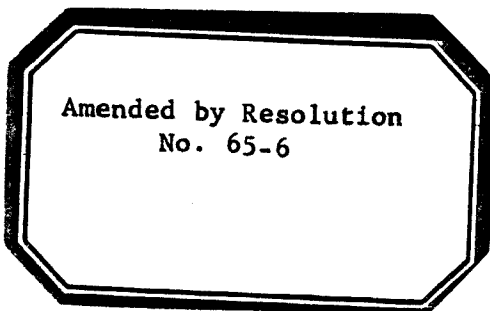
WHEREAS, the study will be beneficial to the Tribe in the management of its wildlife resources.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Branch of Wildlife Research, Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service is hereby authorized to conduct a research project to study the habitat requirements of the Merriam Wild Turkey on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for a period of ten years.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for one year only, on the date hereof, the said Bureau is further authorized to trap and retain not to exceed thirty six turkeys for the purpose of conducting crop content studies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all copies of all reports and findings of said studies be made available to the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

the foregoing resolution was on June 5, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
