## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the McNary Cinder Pit has been used for a garbage dump by Southwest Forest Industries, Inc., and
- WHEREAS, this cinder pit has reached such a deplorable condition that it has become necessary to close the pit.
- BE IT RESOLVED that Cooley Mountain Truck Trail Cinder Pit be reopened for the sale of cinders at the rate of twenty five (25) cents per cubic yard and a minimum sale to be established at Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all persons removing cinders check in at the Hon-dah Service Station and that the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise be paid the sum of five cents (5¢) per cubic yard by the Tribe for all cinders that are inspected by the said Recreation Enterprise.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Arizona State Highway Department, Navajo, and Apache Counties shall not be bound by any of the provisions of this resolution.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Resolution No. 61-61 adopted on June 16, 1961 is hereby rescinded.

The foregoing resolution was on June 5, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
