RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mr. Jack Neal of Gila County, Arizona, has requested from the Tribe a prospecting permit covering eighty acres of unpatented lode asbestos mining claims located in the vicinity of the Apache Claims, A-6 through A-11, Gila County, Arizona, and
- WHEREAS, it is advantages to the Tribe to issue said prospecting permit.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is hereby authorized to issue for and on behalf of the Tribe a 60-day prospecting permit covering eighty acres of ground located in the vicinity of those unpatented lode asbestos mining claims, commonly known as Apache Claims A-6 through A-11, Gila County, Arizona.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that prior to the issuance of said permit the said Jack Neal give a legal description of the area he desires to prospect in.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Jack Neal, prior to the issuance of the said permit pay to the Tribe the sum of \$100.00 to prospect for the said sixty days.

The foregoing resolution was on August 14, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 284).
