

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Hunting and Fishing Code of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Ordinance Number 14, Section 6 (b), provides that open seasons and bag limits on fish for tribal members shall be fixed by the Council from time to time as conditions warrant, and

WHEREAS, the present limit of fifteen (15) fish per day for tribal members is considered to be in excess to the needs of the average individual, and

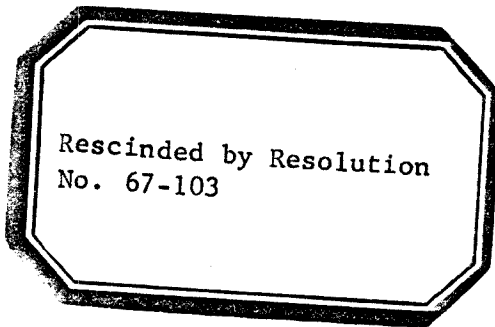
WHEREAS, the Tribal Game Wardens and the Recreation Enterprise Board of Directors have recommended a reduced limit in order to discourage waste and effect a more equitable distribution of the fishery resource among tribal members.

BE IT RESOLVED that the daily bag limit for tribal members be fixed at ten (10) fish per day or in possession.

The foregoing resolution was on September 4, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
