RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Hal Butler, the Fort Apache Timber Company Sales Manager has exemplified himself not only as an outstanding salesman, but an excellent public reations person for the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, it is often necessary that the said Hal Butler entertain persons doing business with Fort Apache Timber Company, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe will benefit by the said Hal Butler having hunting and fishing privileges on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED that Hal Butler is hereby granted tribal hunting and fishing privileges for a period of five years or until he is no longer employed by the Tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Hal Butler is only allowed the bag limits as authorized by the state of Arizona to Arizona hunting and fishing licensees.

The foregoing resolution was on September 5, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
