

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Honorable Carl Hayden, United States Senator from Arizona, has through his great stature and leadership in the United States Senate, been extremely instrumental in effectuating a new Indian Health Center in Phoenix, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, there has been a great need for said Health Center, and

WHEREAS, the Indian Health Program will be promulgated by the construction of the said Medical Center, and

WHEREAS, the said Carl Hayden has been a great benefactor for the Indian people during his tenure of office.

BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that for and on behalf of the entire membership of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is deeply appreciative of the sincere, outstanding effort extended by the Honorable Carl Hayden, United States Senator from Arizona, in effectuating the establishment of an Indian Medical Center in Phoenix, Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
