RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe owns and operates the Fort Apache Timber Company, and
- WHEREAS, there is an acute shortage of housing for Tribal employees, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council believes that not less than two houses should be built adjacent to the Fort Apache Timber Company sawmill for housing supervisory personnel in the immediate future, and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Fort Apache Timber Company at its meeting on November 20, 1963 recommended two houses be built for the use of the Manager and Foreman as soon as possible with further Tribal Housing at a future date on the millsite for other mill workers, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Construction Enterprise can build the houses thereby making work available for tribal members.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Council hereby authorizes the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council to build one, four-bedroom house and one, three-bedroom house at a cost of not to exceed \$30,000.00 near the Fort Apache Timber Company millsite.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Budget for the White Mountain Apache Tribe, Fiscal Year 1964 is hereby amended to provide construction of said houses at not to exceed \$30,000.00.

The foregoing resolution was on December 4, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i), (k) and (s) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
