RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council has previously gone on record by Resolution No. 64-93, dated September 2, 1964, favoring location of a Job Corps Camp on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, tentative site selection had been made at Williams Creek for the proposed Job Corps Camp, and
- WHEREAS, it is now concluded that the Williams Creek site is inadequate for this purpose from the standpoints of accessibility, climate and desirability and suitability of existing structures for a Job Corps Camp.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council now favors construction of a new Job Corps Camp at a site on Kinishba Flats, said site located five miles west and north of Fort Apache and 8.4 miles southeast of Whiteriver, Arizona.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council will approve a gratuitous lease to the Office of Economic Opportunity on a designated area not to exceed forty acres on Kinishba Flats for the purpose of erecting a Job Corps Camp and related facilities.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman is authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the establishment of said Job Corps Camp and the issuance of a gratuitous lease on said site for the maximum period allowable by law.

The foregoing resolution was on January 6, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article 7, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
