## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is cognizant of the fact that there are innumerable youths between the ages of 16 and 21 and residing on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation who could and should participate in the Neighborhood Youth Corps Program, and
- WHEREAS, it is the unanimous concensus of opinion that the Chairman of the Tribe should proceed expeditiously in having the Tribe participate in this program.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman is hereby authorized and directed to enter into any and all types of agreements with the U. S. Department of Labor, Manpower Administrations or with any other Branch of Government to effectuate the Tribe's participation in the Neighborhood Youth Corps Program under the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman is further authorized and directed to apply for any and all funds necessary to consumate this program and further authorized to obligate the Tribe to contribute, as its share of the cost of the program, in kind or in cash, a sum not to exceed ten percent of the cost of said program.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman is hereby instructed that the Council unanimously agrees that in carrying out the provisions of this act, he is authorized and directed to sign any non-discriminatory conditions with the U. S. Government.

The foregoing resolution was on April 7, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
