## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, a market for aspen lumber appears to be developing, and
- WHEREAS, the Concho Lumber Company contemplates an annual production of 4,000,000 board feet of aspen lumber, and
- WHEREAS, the Concho Lumber Company requests that an aspen timber sale be initiated on the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, there are available large quantities of merchantable aspen sawtimber in the North Fork Block that heretofore have not been utilized as a source of additional income for the benefit of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED that an aspen timber sale of approximately 4,000,000 board feet be initiated in the vicinity of McKay's Peak.

The foregoing resolution was on July 7, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
