## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Resolution No. 65-21 granted permission to the Bureau of Indian Affairs to survey an area located in Cedar Creek, Arizona of approximately five acres for a school site, and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has now selected a site and furnished a legal description and drawings of the area desired.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman is authorized to execute a twenty-five year lease with a twenty-five year option to the Bureau of Indian Affairs covering approximately 13.4 acres as described on the official plat of said area on file in the office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said lease provide, among other things, that if at any time the Bureau of Indian Affairs fails to use the aforementioned site for the administration of Indian Affairs, the lease shall terminate.

The foregoing resolution was on September 2, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
