RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Council has received numerous complaints regarding operation of the Post Office in connection with the Apache Traders in Cibecue, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council does not believe that a local Post Office should be connected with and operated by any local Indian Trader.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it is respectfully requesting that the U. S. Post Office Department establish a Post Office separate from the Indian Trader's business and housed in a separate building.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the U. S. Post Office Department is agreeable to this proposal, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe will endeavor to secure proper building for the Post Office.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a local resident of Cibecue, preferably a member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe be appointed as Postmaster or Postmistress.

The foregoing resolution was on September 16, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
