RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to create employment for members of the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, a juniper eradication program has been carried out in the Cibecue area leaving many down juniper trees making portions of the range-lands unusable and unsitely, and
- WHEREAS, Resolution No. 65-15 provides us for prices for forest products and the issuance of Form 5-924a for small purchases of timber.
- BE IT RESOLVED that Resolution No. 65-15 and the attached schedule of prices is hereby amended under miscellaneous forest products prices, Items 6, fuel wood in dead or down, all species. (3) \$1.00 per cord and instruction (6) is amended to read, "Free to Tribal members for home use but not to be cut from areas under contract, any and all dead and down timber may be cut by members of the Tribe and sold on the open market."

The foregoing resolution was on November 10, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
