

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Ira Holliday has been overpaid the sum of \$14,025.66 pursuant to his sawing and logging contracts with the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe, to no avail, has attempted to have the United States sue the said Ira Holliday, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe is of the opinion that their Tribal Attorney, Barry DeRose and Fort Apache Timber Company Manager, Hal Butler are in a better position to present action in their own names.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman is authorized and directed to assign the said cause of action against Ira Holliday to the said Barry DeRose and/or Hal Butler.

The foregoing resolution was on January 5, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
