



RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Section 18 (c) of the Cibecue No. 1 Logging Unit Timber Contract No. 14-20-0450-5026 purchased by Reidhead & Chlarson Lumber Company specified that all timber from this sale must be manufactured at a sawmill at Cibecue, Arizona, and
- WHEREAS, there is an oversupply of logs at the Cibecue mill and the Carrizo sawmill will have to shut down for about one week because of a modification of the companies logging operation, and
- WHEREAS, the purchaser of the Cibecue No. 1 Logging Unit has requested that this contract be modified to allow him to haul a maximum of 500,000 board feet of logs from Cibecue No. 1 Logging Unit to be manufactured at his mill at Carrizo, and
- WHEREAS, this appears to be to the best interest of the Tribe and does not relieve the purchaser of any minimum cutting requirements.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Cibecue No. 1 Logging Unit be modified to permit the purchaser to haul the maximum of 500,000 board feet to the company mill at Carrizo.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said logs to be hauled on or before thirty days from the approval of same by the contracting officer.

The foregoing resolution was on June 2, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
