RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, many of the law and order codes under which tribal governments operate are obsolete, and
- WHEREAS, because of these inadequate codes very often the civil rights are jeopardized, and
- WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Interior has available forces of knowledgeable persons to prepare a model code.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Interior is hereby requested to prepare a model law and order code, if they so desire, which code shall include, without limitation, a juvenile code for use by all Indian Tribes in the United States and Alaska.

The foregoing resolution was on December 8, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
