

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the existing airstrip at the Whiteriver Airport is not long enough to permit landing of multi-engine planes, and


WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs would like to extend this airstrip to permit landing of slurry planes, and

WHEREAS, it would also be advantageous to the Bureau and the Tribe if a fenced area could be provided for the helicopter and slurry plane.

BE IT RESOLVED that permission be granted to the Bureau of Indian Affairs to extend and use the existing strip, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an area approximately 250' x 500' be fenced and necessary utilities be developed to house personnel and to permit storage of aircraft and supplies.

The foregoing resolution was on January 30, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
