RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Recreation Enterprise has entered into a facilities lease with the Standard Oil Company of California said facilities lease covering the Apache and Carrizo Service Stations, and
- WHEREAS, Standard also furnishes patroleum products to other service stations on the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, Shell Oil Company furnishes patroleum products to the Indian Pine Service Station, and
- WHEREAS, all of the said stations are in need of repair, and
- WHEREAS, the Humble Oil Company, the Standard Oil Company of California and the Shell Oil Company were requested to submit a new facilities lease covering all of the service stations on the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Humble Cil Company's proposal was included and offer to spend in excess of \$10,000.00 above that of the other companies for repairs to the said stations and further included a constant maintenance and training courses superior to that of the other stations, and
- WHEREAS, the said Humble Oil Company offered to lend to the Tribe the approximate sum of \$21,000.00 to satisfy the indebtedness owed by the Tribe to Standard at no additional cost to the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the said facilities leases with Standard contain a 30 day cancellation clause.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman is hereby authorized to sign any and all documents necessary to effectuate a new facilities agreement with the Humble Oil Company to furnish Humble products at all of the Service Stations located on the reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman is further authorized to terminate any and all facilities leases or agreements with the Standard Oil Company of California.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman is hereby authorized to borrow the approximate sum of \$21,000.00 from the Humble Oil Company, said sum to be used to pay off the indebtedness due the Standard Oil Company of California.
