

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Arizona Highway Department is constructing new bridges at Post Office Canyon and Round Top Wash, and

WHEREAS, there is inadequate gravel on the presently approved permit issued July 20, 1966 at Post Office Canyon.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Arizona Highway Department be issued a permit for sand and gravel on the following described land:

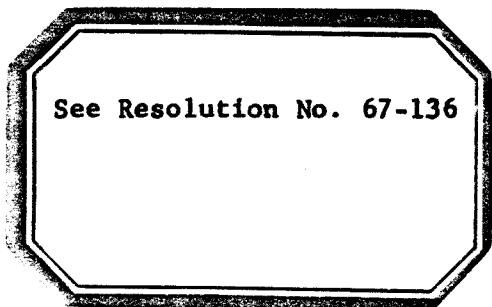
Along the flood plain of Post Office Canyon in parts of the S½ NE¼, NW¼ NE¼, N½ NE¼ SE¼, of Section 29, all in unsurveyed and protracted sections, T7N, R23E, G&SRBM, Navajo County, Arizona.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Arizona Highway Department pay the following rates computed on a tonnage basis for the removal of said sand and gravel:

Three cents (3¢) per ton for all borrow; Six cents (6¢) per ton for all select, ABC, MA; and Ten cents (10¢) per ton for all screenings.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tribal Council is hereby authorized and directed to execute a permit for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on May 3, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
