

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, on April 19, 1967 (Resolution No. 67-75) the Tribe consented to the cutting of timber on the Fort Apache Timber Company sawmill block prior to an appraisal of stumpage rates to prevent a shut down of the sawmill, and


WHEREAS, this cutting area has been called the Elk Canyon Modification Logging Unit, and


WHEREAS, the following stumpage rates have been appraised for this area:

<u>SPECIES</u>	<u>RATE PER MBM</u>
Ponderosa pine	\$12.50

BE IT RESOLVED that the above rates be charged for timber cut on this logging unit.

The foregoing resolution was on July 18, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
