RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the forest resources of the Fort Apache Reservation are of primary economic importance to the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, as a part of its responsibility in managing the natural resources of the reservation, has presented to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe a timber management plan which has been reviewed by the Council and its legal advisors, and
- WHEREAS, the objectives of the plan for the Fort Apache Reservation forest appear to be consistent with the best interests of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and its members and are in conformance with the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, and the proposale for carrying out these objectives appear to be reasonable and sound.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Timber Management Plan of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Arizona, 1967, prepared by the Branch of Forestry, Fort Apache Agency, be approved and submitted to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs to be approved, subject to review at any time by the Tribal Council with the right to make recommendations or modifications as is deemed necessary.

The foregoing resolution was on December 6, 1967 duly adopted by a vete of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section I (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat, 984).
