

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. has requested permission to survey and construct an electric distribution system across tribal lands of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, said powerline will be for the purpose of serving the residences of Delta Brewer and William Duryea in the Post Office Canyon area north of Whiteriver, Arizona.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. is hereby granted permission to make surveys and construct the powerline in accordance with their application and maps which are on file in the office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency to which reference is hereby made.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent is authorized to grant a right of way to the Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc., pursuant to the official plat of said area on file in the office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the right of way agreement provide that Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. shall repair and maintain all fences which might be damaged due to the maintenance of same.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. reseed all areas where vegetation is destroyed by the construction or use of said right of way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all damages be waived because of the beneficial results to tribal members that will ensue by the survey and construction of the powerline with the exception of repair of fences and the reseeding of all areas where vegetation is destroyed during construction or use of said powerline.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
